TODAY'S GAME

ODAY the Galloping Gaels from Moraga play host to the Nevada Wolf Pack down from Reno for the first time in three football seasons. Today the Wolves enter the stadium with an old foeman of the Gaels as their coach, "Brick" Mitchell from the University of California.

Twenty-one times the Saint Mary's varsity has met the Wolves from Nevada and in nine of the meetings "Slip" Madigan has been at the helm guiding the Saint Mary's ship to repeated success. Out of the last nine meetings Saint Mary's has returned home victorious seven times, while in 1923 the contest ended in a 10 to 10 deadlock.

Since the only tie game in 1923 the Saints have not only taken a monopoly on the winning of games, but have completely cornered the market on touchdowns. For the last six contests the Wolf of Nevada has returned home the quiet Wolves in white wash.

Now with a new coach the University of Nevada fans are hoping for an increase in the Nevada scoring column as well as mopping up the Far Western Conference teams. Mitchell has a wonderful reputation as a builder of football elevens but too much can not be expected for his first season with the Nevadans.

The game will be a battle of veterans. Nevada has brought fifteen lettermen here supported by fifteen more men, some veterans of last season's campaigns. On the Gael side of the field Slip Madigan has seventeen lettermen backed up by a wonderful crew of last year's veterans and strong charging sophomores, to represent Saint Mary's.

In the Army game last Sunday the fans were amazed at the power displayed by the second and third string players from Moraga. The strength of the fullback position with three sure footed and fast line crashers such as Gordon Partee, George Dodson, and "Greta" Garbo. The three fullbacks from Saint Mary's showed exceptionally well as ground gainers through the center of the Soldier's forward wall.

At last the slow healing injuries are well, and several of the Gael first stringers will be fighting it out in today's game with the Wolves, in order to remain on the coveted first team lineup. Bernard Schaefer, a guard, will play for the first time this year. So will Ed Gilbert, the big tackle from Moraga, who won a berth on the varsity last season when substituting for Toby Hunt, last year's captain.

George Wilson, the pride and joy of San Leandro, will be in the game at left halfback today after being on the shelf at Saint Mary's for the last two weeks with an injured shoulder. Wilson, like his namesake from Washington in 1925, is considered as possible All-American timber for next year. George can pass, punt, and "pack the mail" exceptionally well and is only a sophomore.

"He has the same build as George Gipp of Notre Dame and every time I see him in scrimmage, I see ghosts of years gone by," said Madigan after practice last Tuesday night.

Nevada will have only one advantage and that is the knowing of the plays used by the Gaels against the Army last Sunday. Nevada scouts were in the stands for the Army game, and not a play did they fail to plot for "Brick" Mitchell. But the strong Saint Mary's offensive should not be stopped even if the opposition knows the plays being used perfectly. Defensively the Gaels look far too strong to be worried about the danger of "Wolfmen" scoring on anything but a perfectly timed trick play.


Veterans who will be playing on the Nevada starting lineup are Ken Austin at end, Bob Madariaga and Ole Thies, two outstanding tackles, Bill Beemer and Walter Linehan at guards, with "Bull" Mohorovich at center to make up a formidable line of veteran lettermen. In the backfield Fern Ambrose will call signals, Toby Guffrey and Bud Beasley will be at halves, and Gaile Parsons will back up the line at fullback. Ten of the eleven men on the starting lineup are veterans from last year's campaign, and they should give the Gaels a good game for at least the first half.

Pity the announcers at the broadcasting and public address system mikes. Bill Beasley will be playing quarterback on the Saint Mary's team and Bud Beasley will be "packing the mail" at right half for the Wolves. Bill is number 14 while Bud is only half as high numerically because he wears number 7. B seems to be the favorite initial with the Beasleys.


PACK o' WOLVES
