TODAY'S GAME

OR the fourth time the Oregon eleven comes south to meet the Saint Mary's gridders. The last three games have ended in defeat for the visiting northerners and not since the 7 to 6 game in 1930 have the Webfooters come to San Francisco with as strong a team as Coach Callison now has under his command.

Many people look back at the white washing Oregon received from the Trojans ten days ago and think the Ducks another weak sister of the conference from the north. This is absolutely the wrong way to figure the visitors. They have one of the biggest and strongest lines on the Pacific Coast in Wishard, Nilsson, Clark, Hughes, Frye, Morgan, and Bailey. The backfield is also made up of versatile stars such as Temple, Parke, Gee, Kostka, Mikulak, Pepelnjak and Bowerman. Yet people figure the Oregon eleven as only another football team.

It was the Oregon gridders who gave the multiple-spinning Santa Clara boys their first setback, after the missionites had run rough shod over the Bears. The same Webfoot team turned the trick against a strong Oregon State group of gridmen and without many of their stars the Oregon-Washington game ended in a scoreless deadlock. It is true that the Uclans, who fell before a great Gael offensive by a 14 to 7 score, defeated the Oregon men, but it was a last minute pass by Frankovich which robbed the northerners of a victory.

Today there will be no excuse for the Oregon players not turning in a good performance. Against the Trojans they had the terrific heat as well as the long train ride and the hard Oregon State game to blame their lack of defensive and offensive power onto. Now they have had twelve days to become used to the California sunshine as well as rest for their meeting of the Gaels. Their physical condition is in tip top form and their whole squad will be ready to start with the opening whistle.

For the Gaels the shock troops are scheduled to start the contest. Bill Beasley, who found his real stride in the U. C. L. A. game Armistice day, will start at left half on the starting eleven. However, when the first string players are injected into the fray Beasley will shift from the left side of fullback to the right side and remain in the game. Beasley's returning of punts against the Bruin was nothing short of sensational. On one occasion he fought his way clear of all but the safety man on the most thrilling play of the day.


Charlie Baird, another Saint star, found himself in the Uclan game. His wide end runs and cutbacks over center marked him as the leading ground gainer for the day. Then another surprise in the Uclan game was the keeping of Baird under cover in the passing department of the game. Not a pass did the Saint Mary's left halfback throw in the entire game. This may be the tip off on today's contest as Mister Callison and Company were in the stands on Armistice day. With Baird throwing passes today the Gaels' air attack will be twice as strong as it was against the Bruin, and there was little doubt about the Gaels' passing game that warm day.

In the Saint Mary's forward wall for the shock troops the playing of big "Dutch" Baader at left tackle was a revelation. He broke through the opponents' line repeatedly to nail the ball carrier from behind. Mervyn Yates at center also played a great game. His passing was perfect and at pass defense he intercepted two of the Uclan's forwards. Felix Pennino at right end is another lad on the second eleven at Moraga who is improving rapidly, and do not be surprised if this lad should snatch a pass in the first quarter today and be off for the races.

Walter Harris, that carrot-topped quarterback of the shock troops, is another comer for Slip Madigan's future varsities. He turned in a nice job of blocking last week and in practice sessions he has kept up the pace. Yet there is much for all the sophomores on the second eleven to learn and they are bound to make some mistakes. Last week was their first chance to show anything and it is not fair to rate them too highly on their first performance.

One of the features of today's battle will be the argument between Angel Brovelli of the Gaels and Mike Mikulak from Oregon. Both boys are demons on defense and have line smashing as their specialty when on the offensive part of the game. Mikulak has the reputation of being one of the best fullbacks on the coast this year, while on the other hand the "Dark Angel" has been considered quite a fullback for the past two years. Owing to playing right halfback for the first part of the season many have dropped Brovelli from the fullback position, but today he will prance at the old position again as he did against the Fordham and Uclan elevens.

In the U. C. L. A. game Brovelli gave up ball carrying for the sake of being a blocking back, and it was his excellent blocking which made possible Baird's touchdown which evened up the score. To many in the stands the ball carrier is the only boy who plays the offensive game, but it is always good to remember that someone ahead is helping to clear the way.






