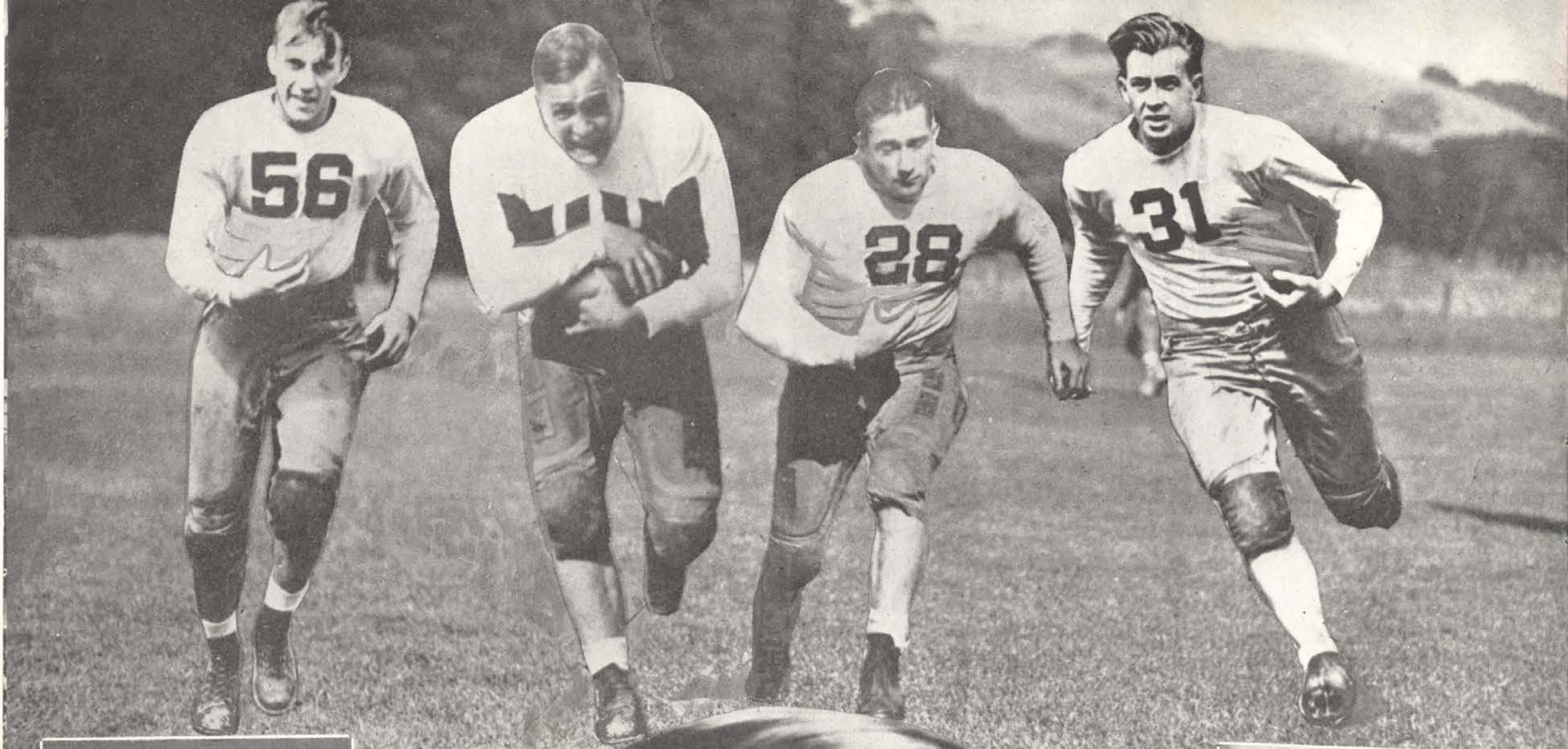

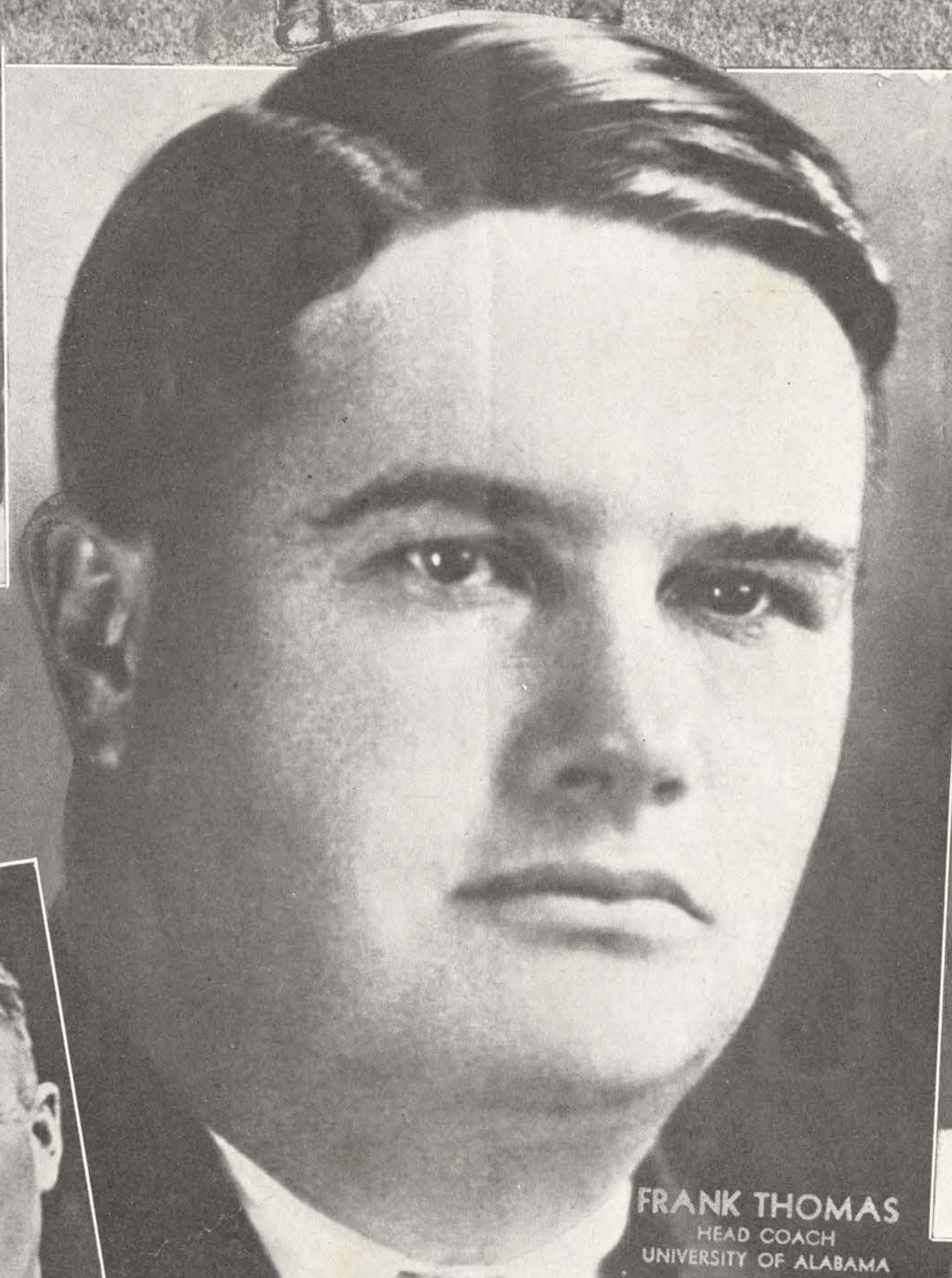

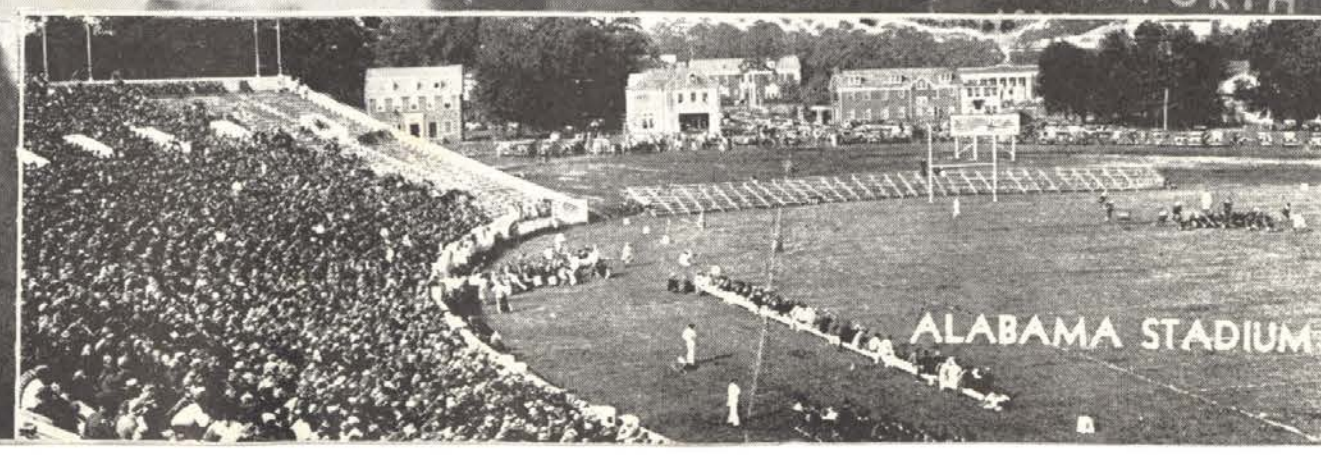

# TODAY'S GAME

SAN FRANCISCO'S second inter-sectional football battle takes place today when the Red Elephants from Alabama and the Galloping Gaels from Saint Mary's meet on the turf. Both teams have met with defeat in the earlier part of their schedule, there is no championship in the offing, but still the game today will be one of the greatest played in this part of the country for the 1932 grid season.

Alabama and its Crimson Tide is the only team ever to have repeated success on the Pacific Coast. In their three previous games on the coast the Bamas have won two and tied one. No team has ever come from the East or South that can present such an inter-sectional record as the one made by the Alabamans.

Under the leadership of Captain John "Hurry" Cain the Elephants will probably enter into today's contest as the favorites. Their line boasts of a record of having only one first down scored through it. Coach Frank Thomas of the Tide claims to have better than 200 pound tackles three deep on each side of the line. While in the backfield there is more than just Mister John Cain to make the offensive powerful. Chappell and Howell

are the visitors' big threats in the over head department of the game. Some southern critics claim Chappell can handle a pigskin as well as Gilbert of the Southern Methodist last year, and that boy could throw a mean pass.

While for the Gaels Brovelli will be playing his last football game in college, the same goes for six other Gael players. Vivaldi at left end will end his services for the Red and Blue when the game ends, as will Gould at tackle, Charlie Baird, and Captain Bill Beasley in the backfield. Dutch Rubel will be snapping back the ball for the last time in today's game and Pendleton will also climax his college football career.

It is in the fact that the seven boys from Saint Mary's are playing their last football game under the Gael banner that their chances for victory rest. Slip Madigan, himself, stated "If Saint Mary's is going to win the Alabama game they must play twenty per cent better football than they did at any time this season." The Gaels must rise to greater heights than they did in their eighty yard march to a touch-down against Oregon. They must play inspired football to win from the invading Alabamans.

Forward passes will probably fill the air this afternoon. With the Elephants' line being only half as strong as advance reports make it the Gaels will have to return to their passing game of the 1931 season. The "Scarlet Raiders" of 1931 will have to take to the air again as they did against the Trojans and Mustangs last year.

With the injury of Bill Beasley in the Oregon game last week the Saints have lost the power of one of their most elusive safety men. Beasley's injury is of such a nature that it will not be known until game time whether or not he will play today. Without the use of Beasley the Gaels are robbed of the services of their most accurate passer.

There will be an interesting fight on between Angel Brovelli and John Cain of the Tide in today's game. Cain has been picked by many southern writers as All-American fullback. On the other hand, Brovelli has gained the same distinction in this section of the country. Both boys do the lion's share of the punting for their teams, they both are known by their many opponents as great blockers and defensive men. While neither of the two boys passes, they do carry the ball on line smashing thrusts at center and quite frequently dart around end with speed which only a halfback should possess. Yes, the boy who shows up

the better today will have the edge on the mythical fullback job.

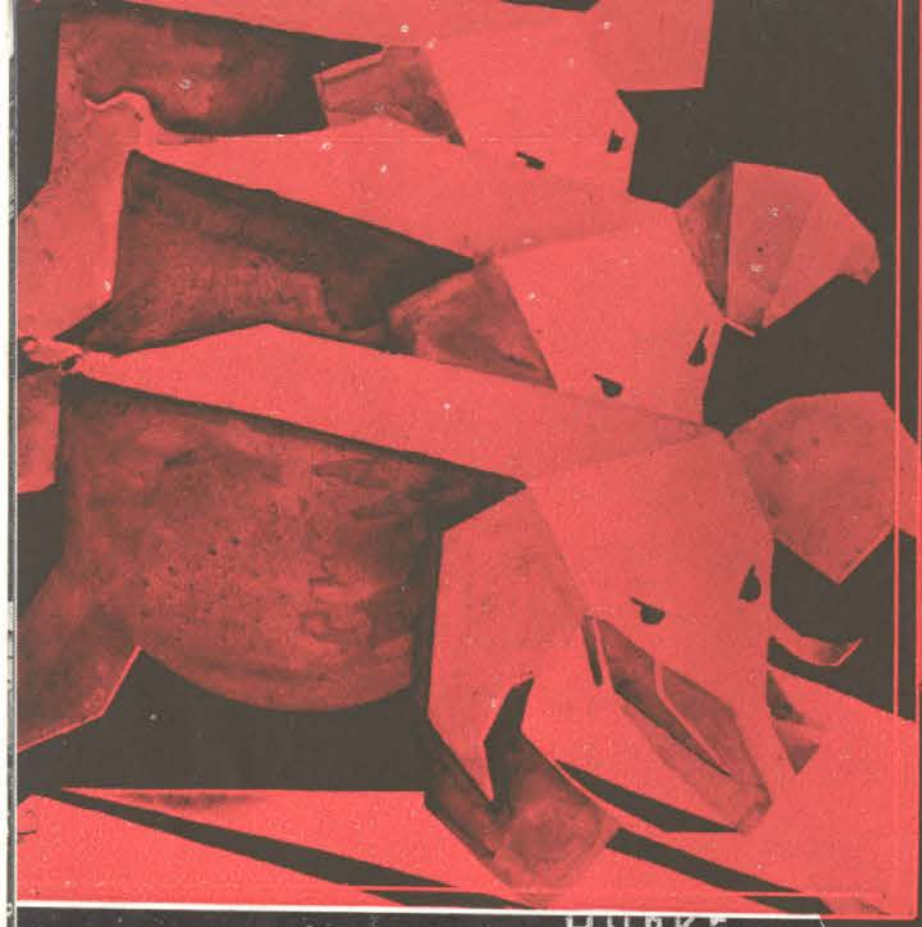
The right side of the Gael line will have an excellent opportunity in blocking punts today. Cain is a left-footed punter and this should give the right side of the Saints' forward wall the break on punt blocking. Possibly if Gilbert and Fred Canrinus get together they can cut down Cain's punting average to where the southerners will think someone else is punting for the Tide.

At any rate, with the Bamas recognized as the strongest eleven in the South for the closing grid season and the Gaels' record proving them as the best eleven in these parts the game today should not be lacking in colorful football. Then again when two Notre Dame team mates such as Frank Thomas, coach of the Crimson Tide, and Slip Madigan of the Gaels are sitting on opposite benches there is sure to be a real ball game.

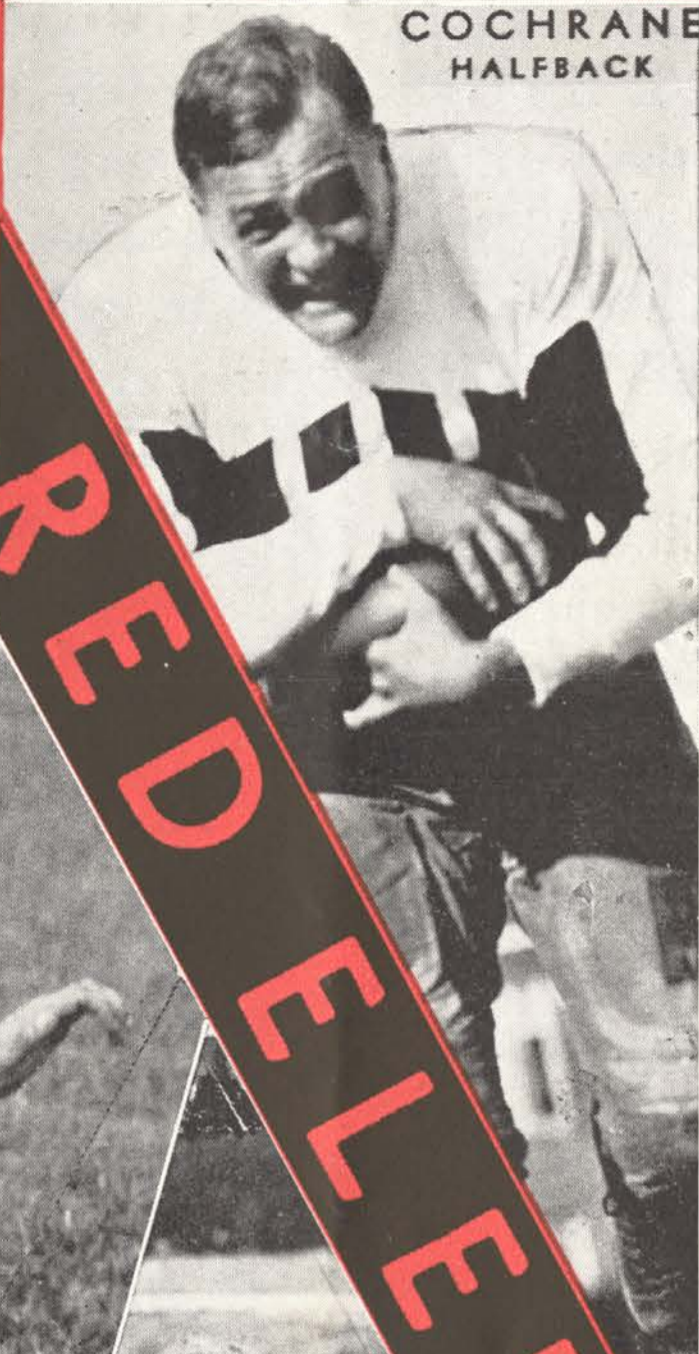
