THE PYROMAGNATES

"At right tackle, McPartland; right guard, Bilotti; center, Ratto; left end, Filiberti; left half, Morales . . . ". No, ladies and gentlemen, this is not the Galloping Gael line-up for today, although the above participants, all Gaelic but McPartland, have scarcely traded the Moraga underbrush for the ocean's undertow. Phelan versus Phelan today, and St. Mary's cannot lose. Several weeks ago when the Sea Lions met the College of Pacific, the Tigers rostered such names as Ahlstrom, Podesto, Ferem, Verutti, and Barnikol, and again it was Phelan versus Phelan. St. Mary's won. In a few weeks the Gaels meet the Tigers and again it will be Phelan battling Phelan. How can St. Mary's be defeated! All of which leads us to search with the theorems of a Euclid for a solution to this dilemma.


Our search is short-lived by merely answering the question: Who is Phelan? On a bleak winter day some two decades past, a determined Irishman grasped the pigskin reins at Purdue University and in several years drove his team to a Big Ten Conference championship, frightening everyone on the way in the meantime. On a cool spring day this same Irishman moved into Seattle, and as head man at the University of Washington, caused the longest and only known gridiron tornado on the West Coast. Finally, on a warm summer day in 1942 the hills of Moraga shook with a tremor that spread to all outlying colleges and universities, for this iron-sided Irishman had agreed to carry on his life's pursuit at St. Mary's College. The Erseman's name was Jim Phelan, a man who would best be termed by a physicist as-Pyromagnetic Phelan.

Why all this patter on one man? Because faced with a shortage of manpower as dire and critical as in any field currently, this man portrayed a wealth of confidence in the great gridiron sport and instilling this confidence into those engineering the wheels of Gael destiny, he proved to be the prime cause of the continuation of football at St. Mary's. But the head mentor did not halt there. In his mind it was not sufficient merely to continue with the season. His was the responsibility to build a team that could face its opponents on competitive terms. This meant bringing into play his many years of matchless mastery and heartfelt living, and of molding a group of young, inexperienced youths into a strong, well-conditioned and fundamentally sound team of football players, able to hold their own physically and in spirit against older, bigger and more experienced men. It also meant fulfilling an obligation to the public by providing the color and art expected as a fair return for money spent. How was this obligation fulfilled? Nobody yet has raised his voice to break the respectful silence that in its very stillness is more thunderous than any cyclone—a job well done... VERY WELL DONE.

And across the greensward today sits Lieutenant Joe Verducci, who has capably and with much spirit contributed a leonine share of time and energy to promote the cause of the pigskin sport. Two pyromagnates clash today. The intensity of their fire and the shock of their lightning should heat and weld a battle into a vivid and electrifying spectacle.—G. P.












