college football- third war edition

St. Mary's and California today present the first Bay Region demonstration that intercollegiate football in all likelihood will survive for a third interesting wartime season.

This traditional opener stands apart from past Gael-Bear encounters in several respects. Neither team has been picked by the pre-season "experts" to win the mythical coast championship. St. Mary's, with a small, young turnout, is supposed to lack depth. The Bears have been overlooked in favor of U.S.C. and U.C.L.A.

Gridiron fans, however, will remember how often the "experts" have been wrong in the past. Either team on the field today may be a surprise.

Head man for the Moraga boys, wily Jimmy Phelan, can be expected to field a team well-grounded in fundamentals

and with enough tricks in store to give a good account of itself. Phelan's ability to get his charges in near mid-season form in time for the opening kick-off is recognized among fans familiar with Irish Jim's long and successful coaching career.

A constant threat to the Bears will be Lloyd Duncan, Gael left half. During pre-season practice, Duncan's accurate passing to Gael ends, Jerry Perich and Jack Shields, has warned the football world that the 1944 Gaels will be a dangerously explosive team.

The Bears this year are likely to display less power football in favor of "wide open," deceptive play. With a line averaging 186 and a backfield averaging 166, the 1944 Bears will have to depend more upon speed and deception than brawn. Coach Stub Allison hopes the double wing and

"T" formations will do the trick.

Running the "T" will be Jim Muir, a non-letterman reserve of last season, or little Bob Celeri. Fresh from Fort Bragg high school in Northern California, Celeri is the lightest man in the Blue and Gold backfield. Today's game will see Celeri under fire for the first time. His coolness while passing under pressure during practice has impressed the coaching staff.

In the preliminary, the Cal Ramblers play host to the Fairfield-Suisun Army Air Base eleven. The visitors are led by player-coach Pfc. John Giannoni, former St. Mary's and Cleveland Rams end.

The Skymasters promise to show the fans plenty of football this season though the base organized a team just this last summer for the first time.

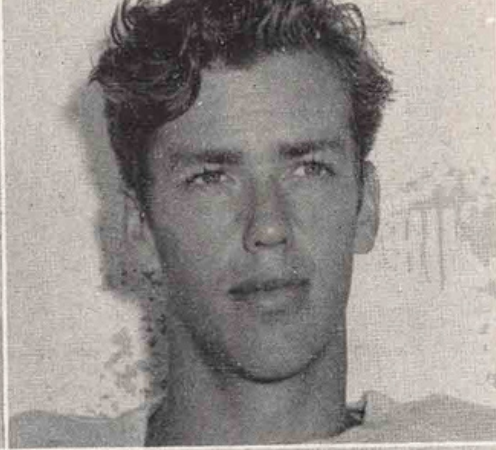
In the first of the half-time stunts,

planned as regular features, the California band, Glee club, Treble Clef and rooting section will provide the entertainment. From the playing field, Glee club and Treble Clef will sing songs honoring St. Mary's College, the Navy, the Army, the Army Air Corps and the Marines. As they sing, the rooting section will execute card stunts in consonance with each particular song.

In memory of California's beloved perennial sophomore, the late Clinton R. "Brick" Morse, two songs written by him will be sung during half-time. The songs chosen are "Sons of California" and "Hail to California."

Today's game, with all its traditional color, suspense and excitement, should prove that intercollegiate football can carry on.

LOST AND FOUND ARTICLES

Loss of articles should be reported at the police station near the stadium North gate (see stadium chart). Those finding articles should turn them in to the police station near the North gate. Those suffering losses in the stadium area may inquire about their property at this station any time within one-half hour after the end of the game. After this time inquiries should be made at the campus police station in room 39 of the University Administration building.

PUBLIC TELEPHONES

REST ROOMS

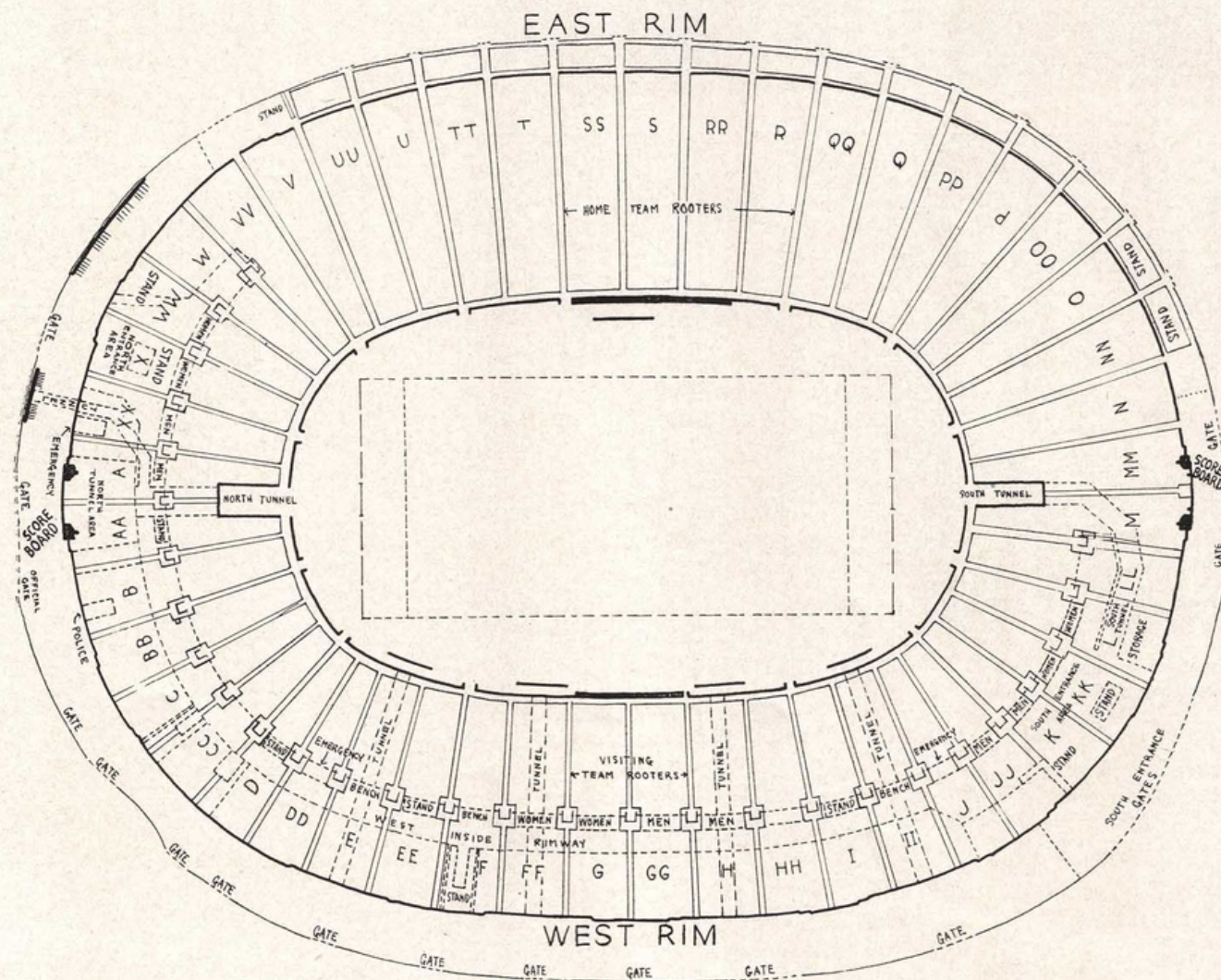
Rest rooms are located underneath the stands. For exact locations see stadium chart.

FIRST AID

First aid may be obtained at the emergency rooms marked on the map of the stadium.

POLICE STATION

The stadium police station is located in



the stadium wall just west of the stadium North gate.

TRANSPORTATION SERVICE

Fast service from San Francisco is provided by the Key System's F line, leaving the East Bay terminal at First and Mission in San Francisco every twenty minutes. Fans may walk up Bancroft way or transfer to the K street car at Adeline and Alcatraz.

In the East Bay, transportation to the stadium is provided by street cars numbered 5 or 6. Those served by the 3, 4 or 7 street car lines and those served by the 62 or 67 bus lines can transfer to the 6 car at University and Shattuck. Other street car and bus lines in Oakland and Berkeley meet either the 5 or 6 car.

PROGRAMS

May we suggest that you save your official souvenir program after today's game and mail it to some friend or relative in the service. Many servicemen have written letters asking for copies of The California Gridiron, your official program. Your thoughtfulness in forwarding your copy to a serviceman will be appreciated.

By writing to Associated Students Publications at the University of California and enclosing 25 cents, copies of any California program will be mailed anywhere in the United States or to Navy, Marine or Coast Guard personnel overseas if the correct fleet post office is included in the address. In the case of Army personnel a written request from the addressee must accompany the order to send a copy of The California Gridiron to a soldier. Additional copies of this program can be obtained from salesmen in the stadium.

REFRESHMENTS

Stands selling refreshments are located within the stadium for the convenience of spectators. The location of these stands is shown on the map of the stadium. For the convenience of spectators who do not wish to leave the stands during the game, salesmen are circulating through the stands.
