## Movie starlet to call Saint Mary's home

## Zabala declares himself to be first king of Saint Mary's College

Nothing has been confirmed, but rumors are swirling that members of the Integral Program

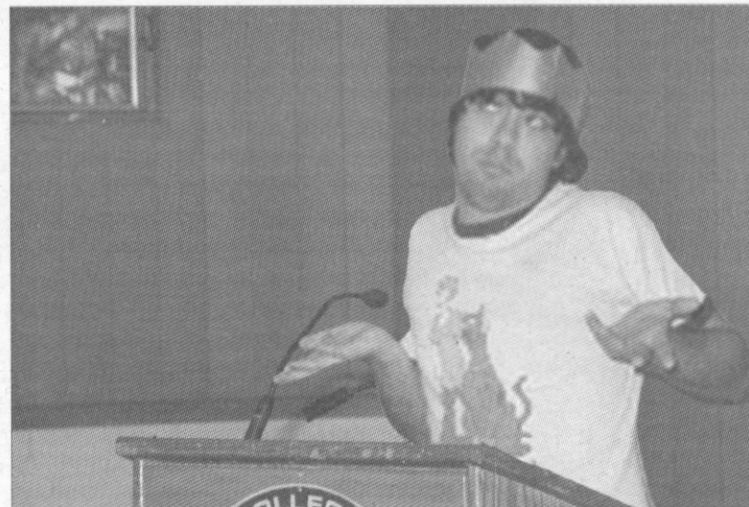

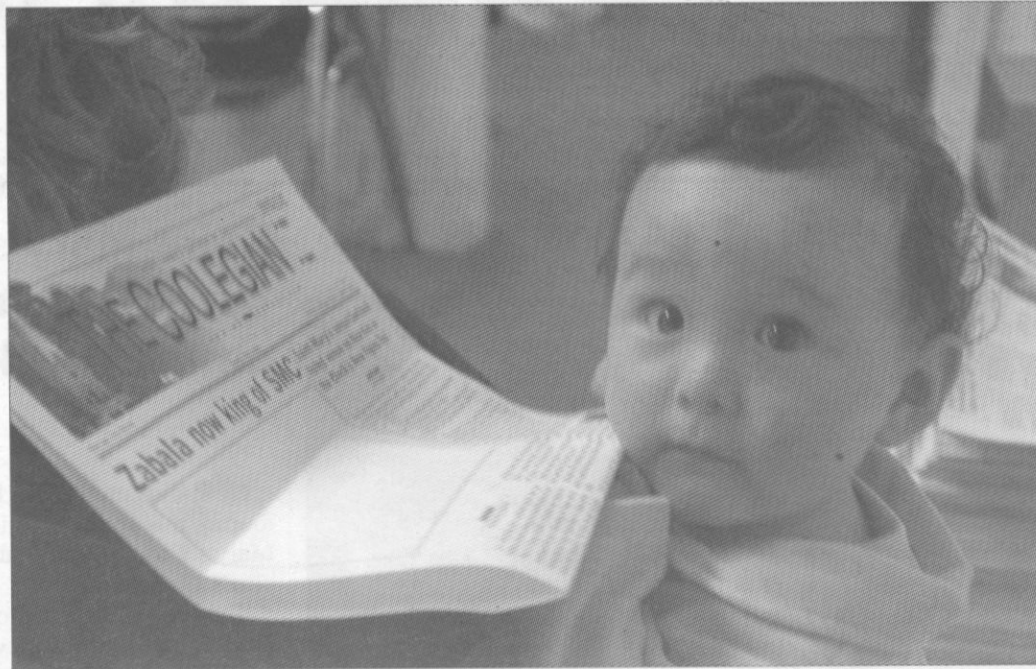

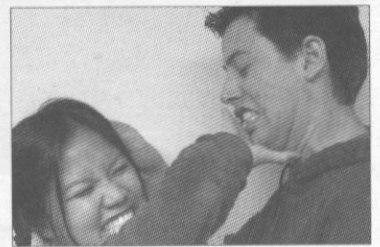

Saint Mary's President shows his myriad of interests and talents

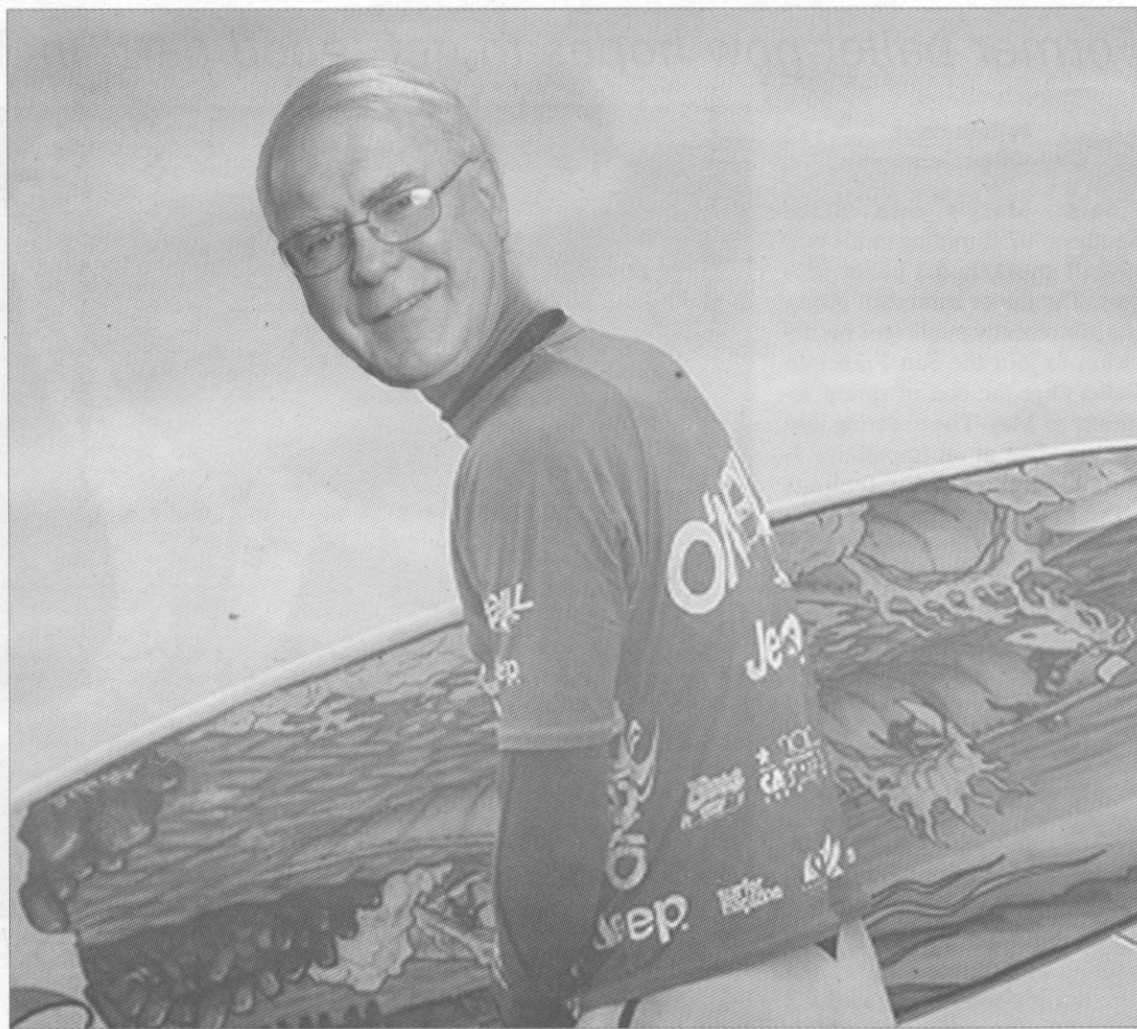

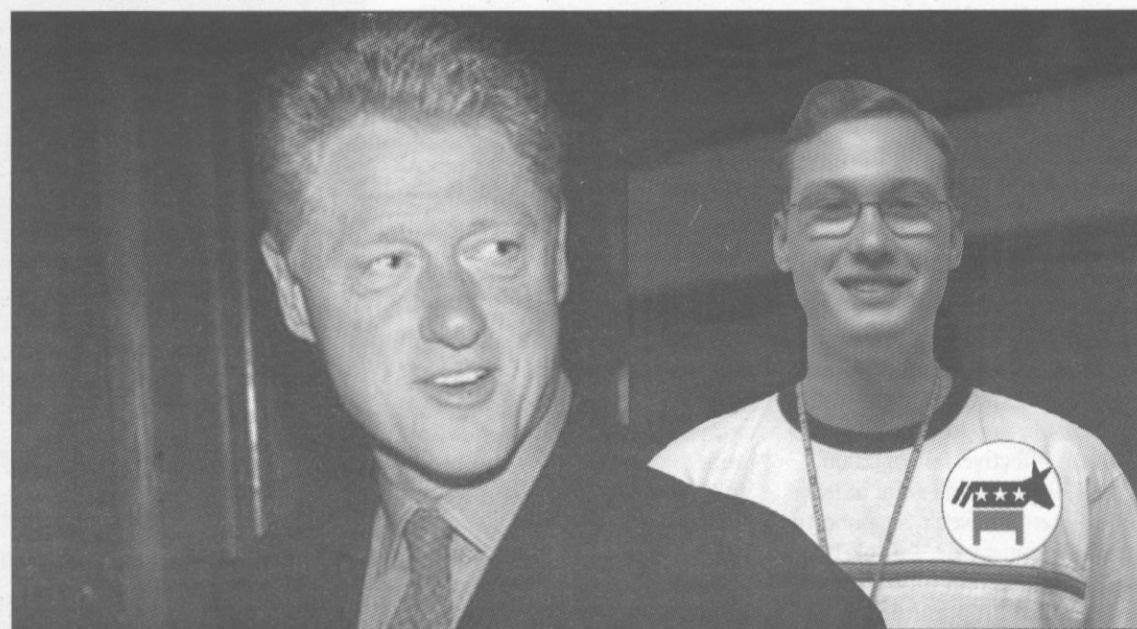
## Scott Cullinane elected president of SMC Democrats

While many students are baffled by this seemingly out of character decision by Sholberg,

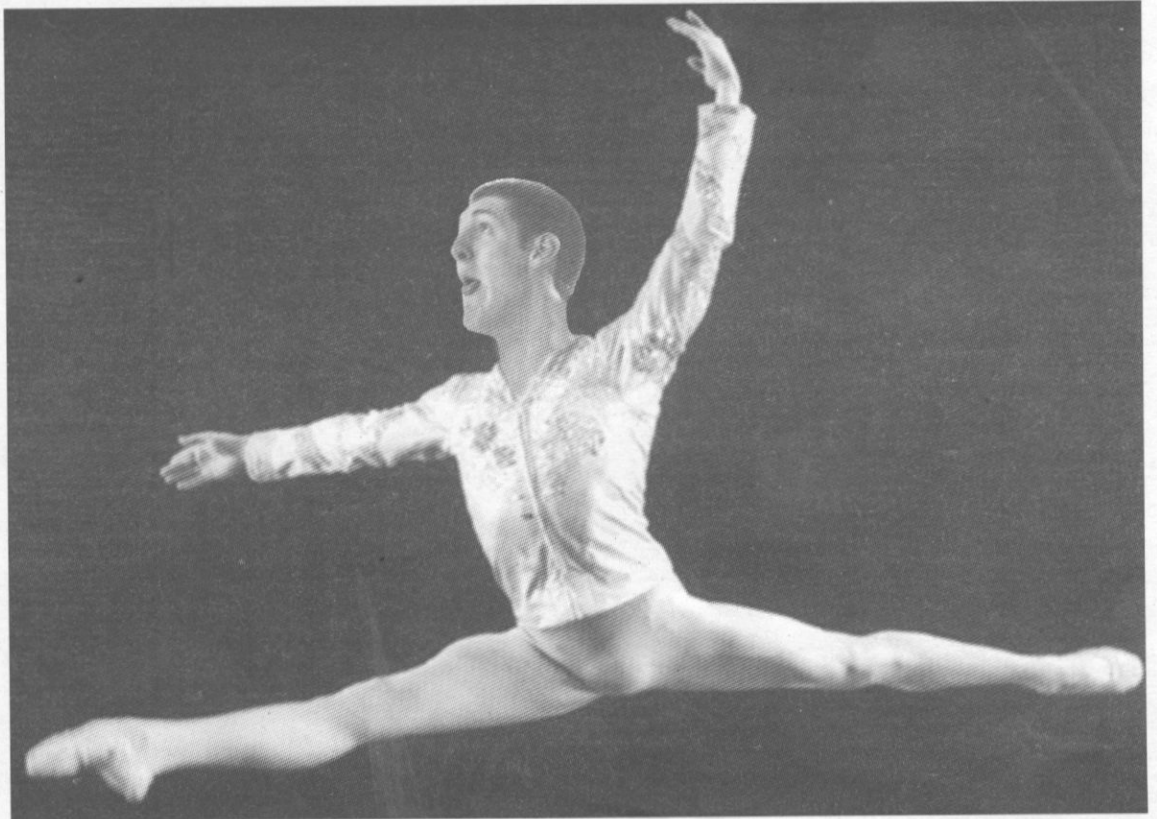

Still some in the know say that

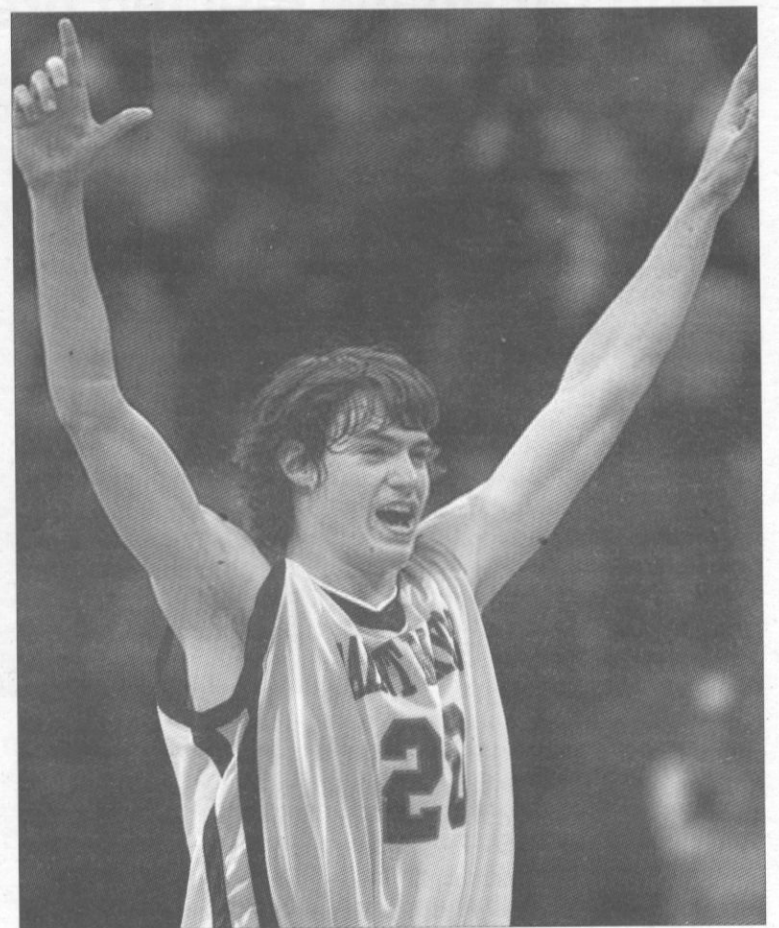
