TODAY'S GAME

THE Gaels from Moraga and the Jarheads from the San Francisco Presidio are at it again. Two veteran teams, the one from the Army and the other from Saint Mary's College P. O., tangle on the field today in their seventh annual game.

Lieutenant "Johnny" Stokes, new coach at the Presidio, meets Edward P. "Slip" Madigan, the master-mind of Moraga, for the first time this afternoon. Last season the Army coach acted in the capacity of head scout for the West Pointers, and it was through his excellent knowledge of the football game that the Army's new defense against the Notre Dame shift stopped the South Benders cold.

How this new defense will affect the Madigan crew cannot be foretold; but it is certain that the Galloping Gaels will gallop today as they have in the past. The winning heart is in the Gaels. They cannot be stopped this year, according to the dopesters, and new defenses or old ones will be the same to the Irish eleven.

Packing the high explosives in the Army backfield will be the "Four G's": Gilbert, Glattly, Goldberg and Gannuzzi. Glattly is the only newcomer to the quartet. Gilbert, Goldberg and Gannuzzi have been packing the power drive together for the last three seasons as Army backs. "Two-Yard" Gannuzzi, the fullback who is beginning his eighth year with the Jarheads, knows all the tricks of the trade, and his vast experience under fire will more than make up for Glattly's inexperience.

Galloping for the Gaels will be the dual quarterbacks, Captain Bill Beasley and Sid Ahern, two of the cleverest safety men and best-grounded signal callers in the business. Others who will pack the mail for the Gaels will be Charles "Rubberlegs" Baird, who will be broken into the open field often this fall by the hard blocking of Angel Brovelli. Gordon Partee, filling Brovelli's shoes at the fullback berth, is a veteran of many Gael campaigns of last fall.

Gone is the familiar and ever popular star of last season, Bud Toscani; but Brovelli, the "Dark Angel," seems to have taken over the right half-back position with little trouble. The hard, smashing drive which marked this Saint Mary's "Terror" as one of the coast's greatest fullbacks is still present when he hits the ends. In the open field, it is sheer power that carries him on rather than tricky steps.

In the line the story is one of college boys with a year or two of experience pitted against soldiers some of whom are playing their fourth or fifth season. Weights are evenly matched, with the Jarheads taking the edge in height. Stemple, a new lineman for the doughboys, will be at right end with his 220 pounds to make his side of the line extra strong. Yet Gilbert of the Moragans at left tackle will be playing opposite the Army giant, and Gilbert tips the scales at 226. Even Stephen, I call it.

From end to end the Gael line will be the same as that which met the Trojans in last season's opener, with the exception of the left guard station. Bill Fischer, another idol of Kezar fans, will be replaced today by Wayne Pendleton, a two-year veteran.

Garry Vivaldi and Fred Canrinus, the two boys who made good against the Southern Methodist aerial attack last December, open at the end positions. Carl Jorgensen, the excitable chap from San Mateo, will be playing at left tackle with Ed Gilbert on the other side of the line. The center trio of Steponovich and Pendleton at guards, with Dutch Rubel doing the snapping back and starring on pass defense, gives the Gaels one of the most powerful lines on the coast this year.

There is little doubt that the Army forwards have had plenty of experience but so have the Gaels; and added to the Moragans' strength in the line is that other important factor: youth.

On paper everything is in the Saints' favor, but yet a stubborn Army crew handed the Olympic Club their first licking just two weeks ago. The Army has one big advantage, and that is its long practice season, which started some six weeks before the Coast Conference allowed college elevens on the field.

New names which may appear on the Saint Mary's team this year and should be watched are (11) Joe Murphy, tackle; (1) George Wilson, left halfback; (40) Allen Nichelini, right halfback; (5) Bill Carpenter, guard; (48) Noel Bonelli, quarterback; (15) George Dodson, fullback; (28) Felix Pennino, end.

THE 1932 season opens—and once again the embattled Army team will make a valiant stand to hold off the Moragans from its goal line—although they have yet to outscore the Gaels in the seven years of competition on record.

St. Mary's, flushed with its sensational victories of the past two years over the nation's major teams and boasting an array of pigskin talent second to none on the Coast, can be expected to furnish plenty of thrills for its followers in this afternoon's battle.

Today's game will no doubt go far toward indicating the potentialities of each team for this season.
