




## **TROJANS**


Merv Yates, the husky center, above right, has served two years on the Gael varsity, playing consistently good football day in and day out, and at times flashing brilliantly against stiff








into the lineup two years ago. Ahern's signal calling and passing and Gerardin's powerful drive are expected to be important factors in the success of the 1933 Gael squad.

## Southern California Band

Back from a trip around the world is Harold William Roberts, director of the famous Trojan band, and back ready to entertain you this afternoon and every afternoon when the S. C. eleven appears in the Coliseum are more than 125 well-trained musicians. Today the Trojan band, with new stunts planned, is ready to put on an entertainment which will complete a perfect football day.

The Trojan band is so much a part of Trojan football that no game can be considered complete without its presence in the Coliseum. Saturday after Saturday the student musicians have appeared between halves at home games. They have travelled to Stanford and California on alternate years to add their share to the pageantry of the big games in the north.

But the Saturday afternoon program is not the only activity of the band. Director Roberts' organization, together with the Men's and Women's Glee clubs visits many cities each year, playing before school and college audiences, clubs, and other groups. The band tours are literally triumphal parades, with throngs greeting the S.C. musicians in every town on their itinerary.

Unlike any other school in the United States, the University of Southern California features a novel singing group. Known as the Trojan Male Chorus, the men's vocal organization fills the spot ordinarily occupied by the average college glee club, and in addition it acts as the singing unit of the band and in all other ways supplements the band program. Such an arrangement consequently provides little opportunity for comparison with other glee clubs which attempt only formal music. It is to the credit of the Male Chorus, however, that it can provide a formal concert or act as a dramatic company if necessary to put across.. a stunt at a football game, which by the way, is no small task in itself.

The Women's Glee club has been acclaimed as one of the leading women's choral organizations of Southern California. Through the stimulation and development of the vocal talents and the additional opportunity for instrumentalists, the club has acquired a number of small groups within itself which tend to enhance the programs which it presents.
