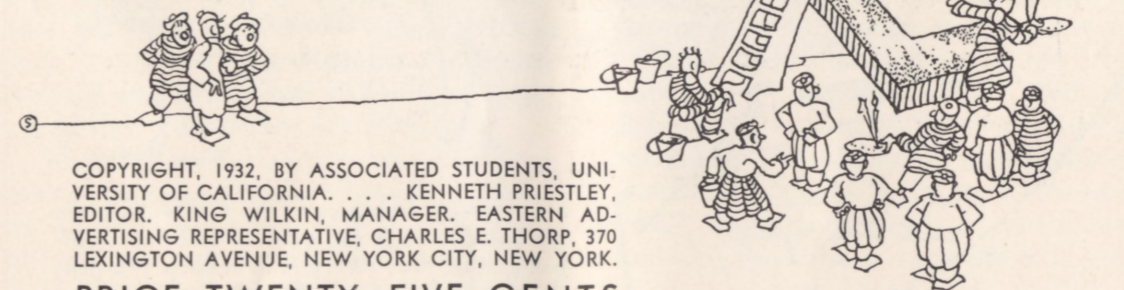

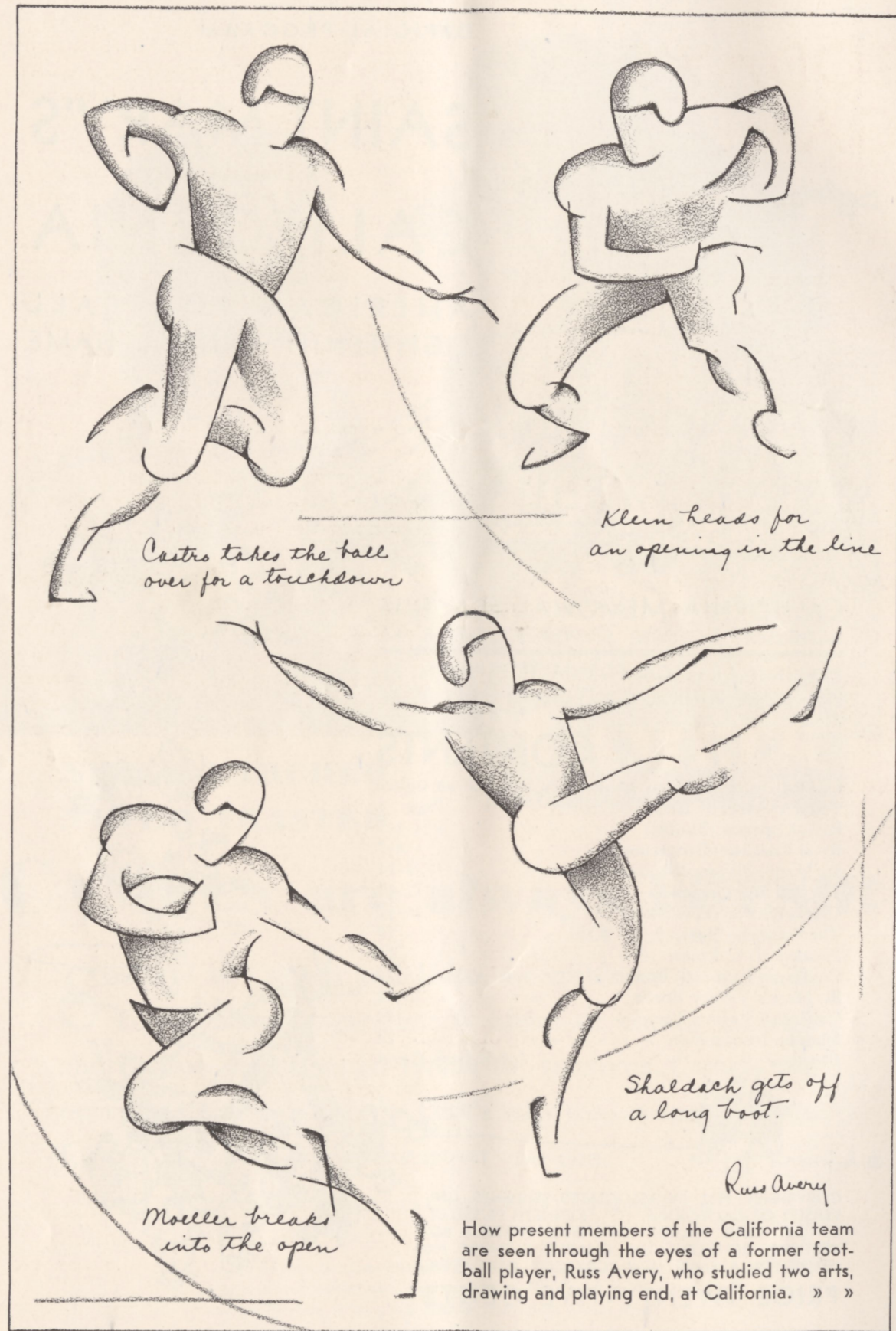

# TODAY'S GAME

The three-ring circus is in town!  
 In this ring in front of you, laydeez and gen'lmun, is Senor Moraga (apologies to Hatlo) and his troupe of animal trainers!  
 And in this second ring, imported from the wilds of the Northwest, the wild and wooly Cougars, under the whip hand of the well-known Bear hunter, Mr. "Babe" Hollingberry!  
 And last but not least in this galaxy of talent, Mr. James Phelan and his performing Huskies!

The old Golden Bear will enter each of the three rings, laydeez and gen'lmun, in succession—in the most ambitious trained animal act to be attempted anywhere on the Pacific Coast this season.

And the old Golden Bear will have to improve his skill on the trapeze if he is to get from Ring 1 to Ring 3 without mishap.

While St. Mary's claims, not without justification, the "toughest schedule in America," the Bears are facing about as strenuous an October set of football dates as could well be scheduled on the Pacific Coast — St. Mary's today, Washington State next week in this stadium, and Washington at Seattle the following week. And all three teams are and will be "pointing" for California.

All of which has little to do with today's game, except that this is the beginning of the campaign, and it is entirely possible that the Bears may meet with a setback here today in Ring Number 1. Senor Moraga and his all-star troupe have prepared their part of the act with care.

There is very little in the way of a basis for comparison of today's opposing teams. St. Mary's has coasted easily and naturally through the first two games of the season. It has been demonstrated to the satisfac-

tion of about everyone that the Galloping Gaels will be tough opponents in a major game, but that is about all. Defensively and offensively, the Gaels are strong — stronger than ever, some observers say. And the Gaels, barring unexpected accidents, will be at maximum strength today.

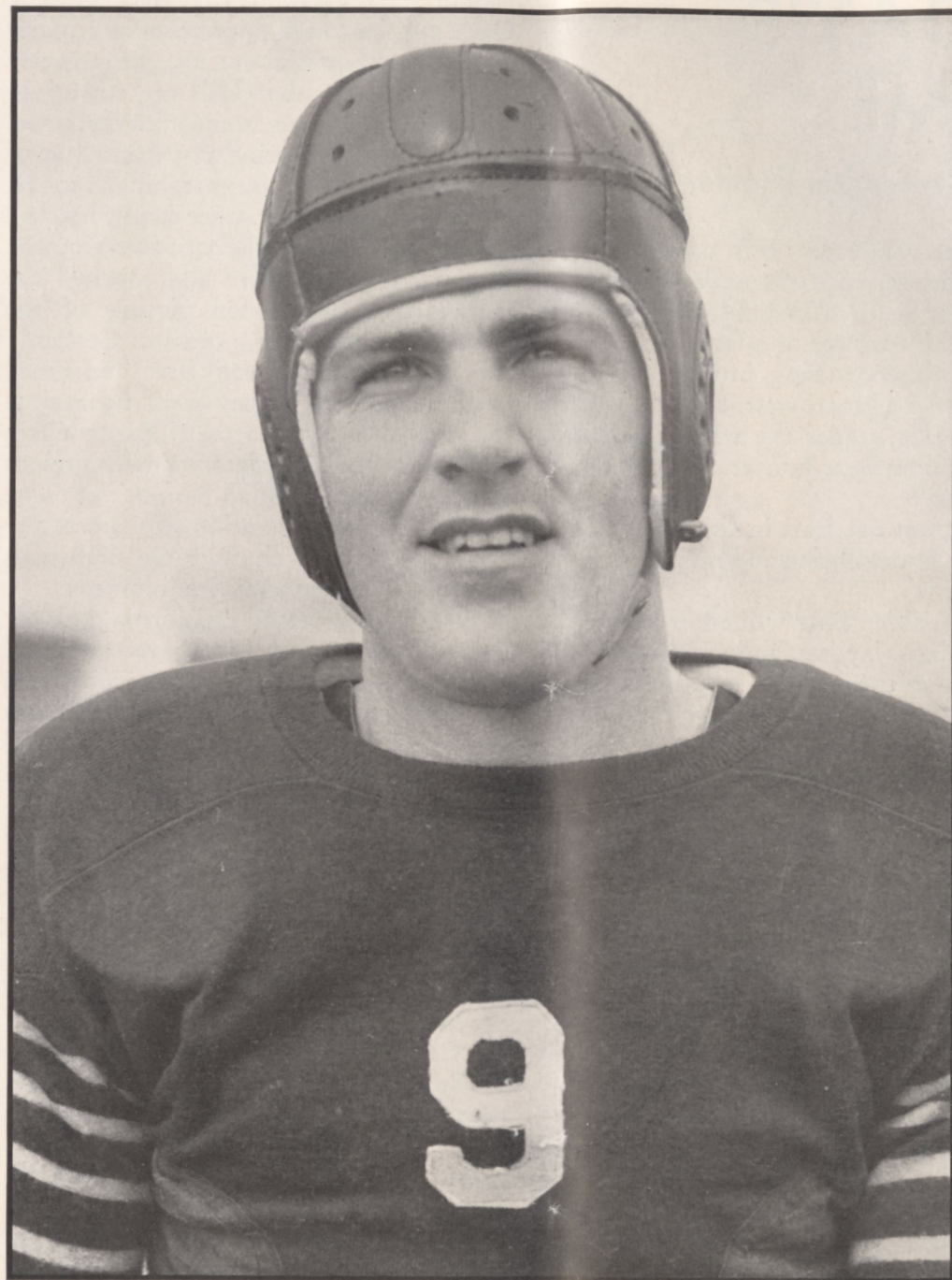
California, on the other hand, has had a tough row to hoe. Perhaps two victories in the "double-header" that opened the season gave a distorted picture of the strength of this year's varsity. Certainly the Bears were not ready for "big time" performance when they went up against the well-drilled Broncos of Santa Clara two weeks ago. The latent power present on the California squad has not yet come to life; if it does come to life this afternoon, look for a thunder-and-lightning conflict on the battered Stadium turf.

St. Mary's defeated California last year 14 to 0, the first St. Mary's victory since 1926. Without subtracting credit from the Gaels, who played a brilliant game throughout, let it be said that the California attack was practically non-existent. St. Mary's had defeated Southern California the week previous with a devastating pass attack, and the aerial bombardment was what accomplished the defeat of the Bears.

Of significance, however, was the fact that only by great effort was the powerful St. Mary's running attack able to pierce the California line. Time and time again the Bear linemen withstood heavy pressure, notably when they resisted a touchdown thrust on the eighteen-inch line. If the St. Mary's game did nothing else, it gave California an experienced set of linemen who later formed what was known as one of the strongest forward walls on the Coast.

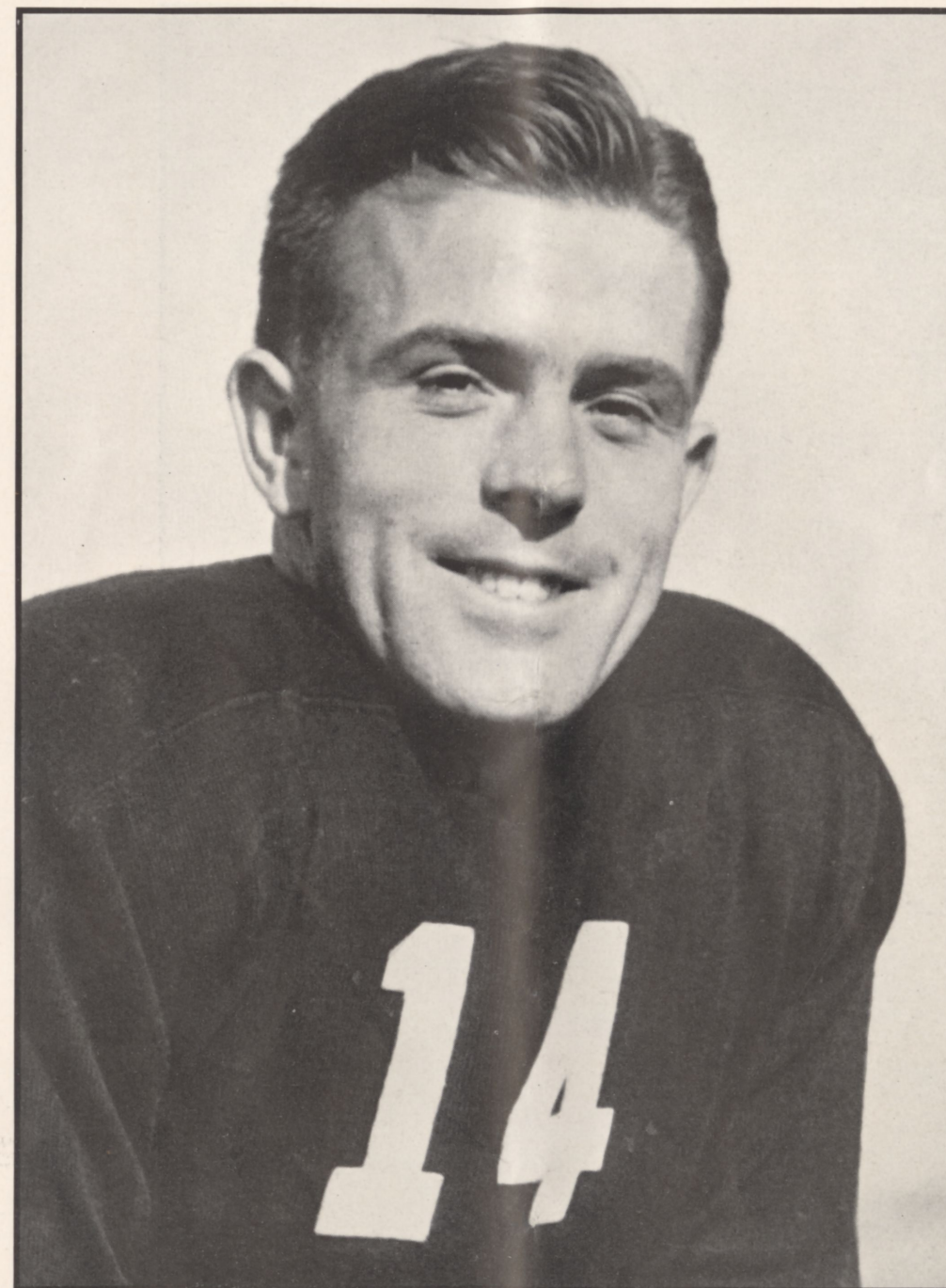
From tackle to tackle—Johnny Ransome, Art Carlson, "Butch" Medanich, Bob McArthur and Dick Tozer—the California line was unchanged throughout the game. And when the gun ended the game, "Bill" Ingram grinned in satisfaction, knowing the linemen upon whom he could

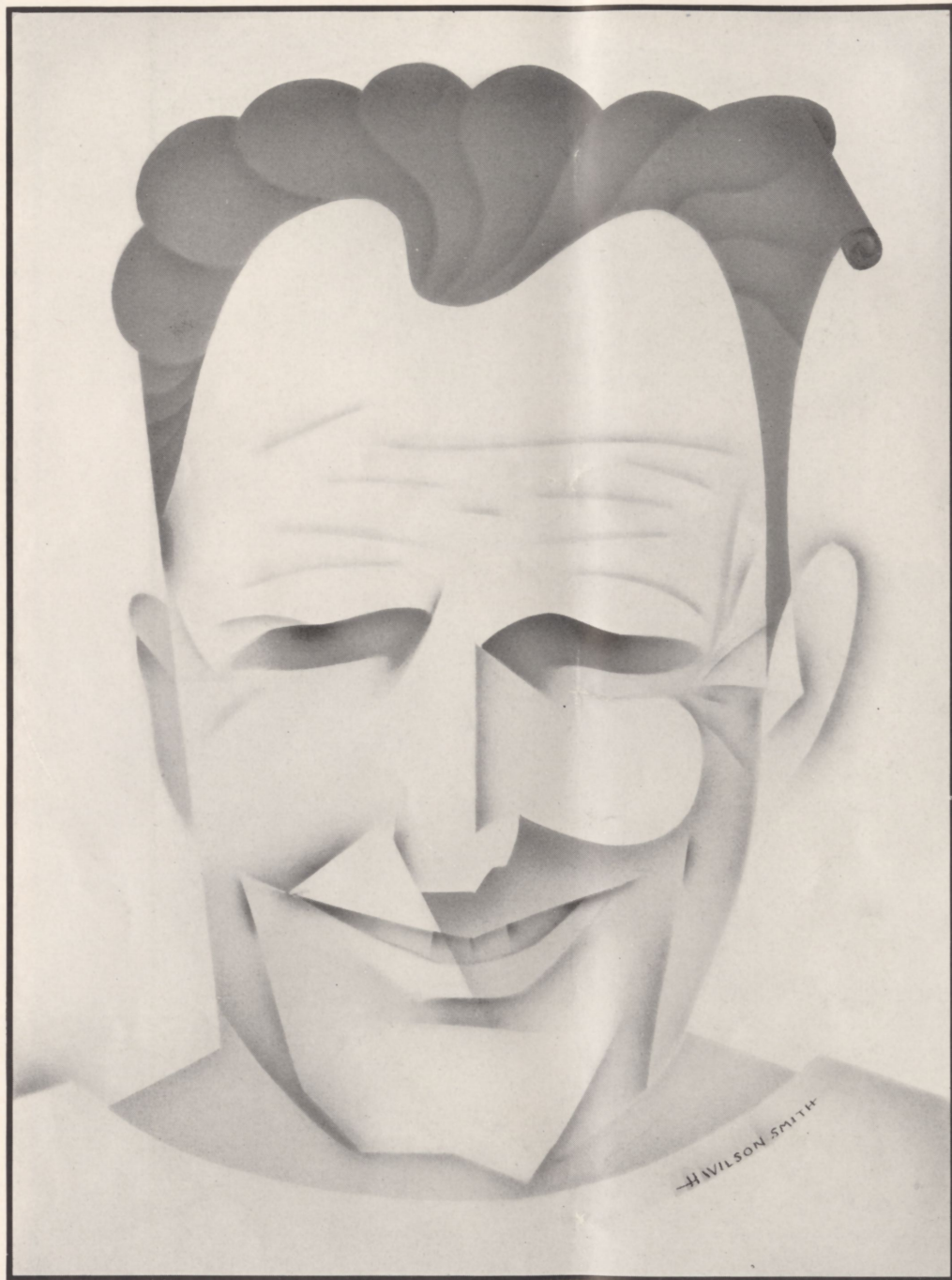
**DICK TOZER**

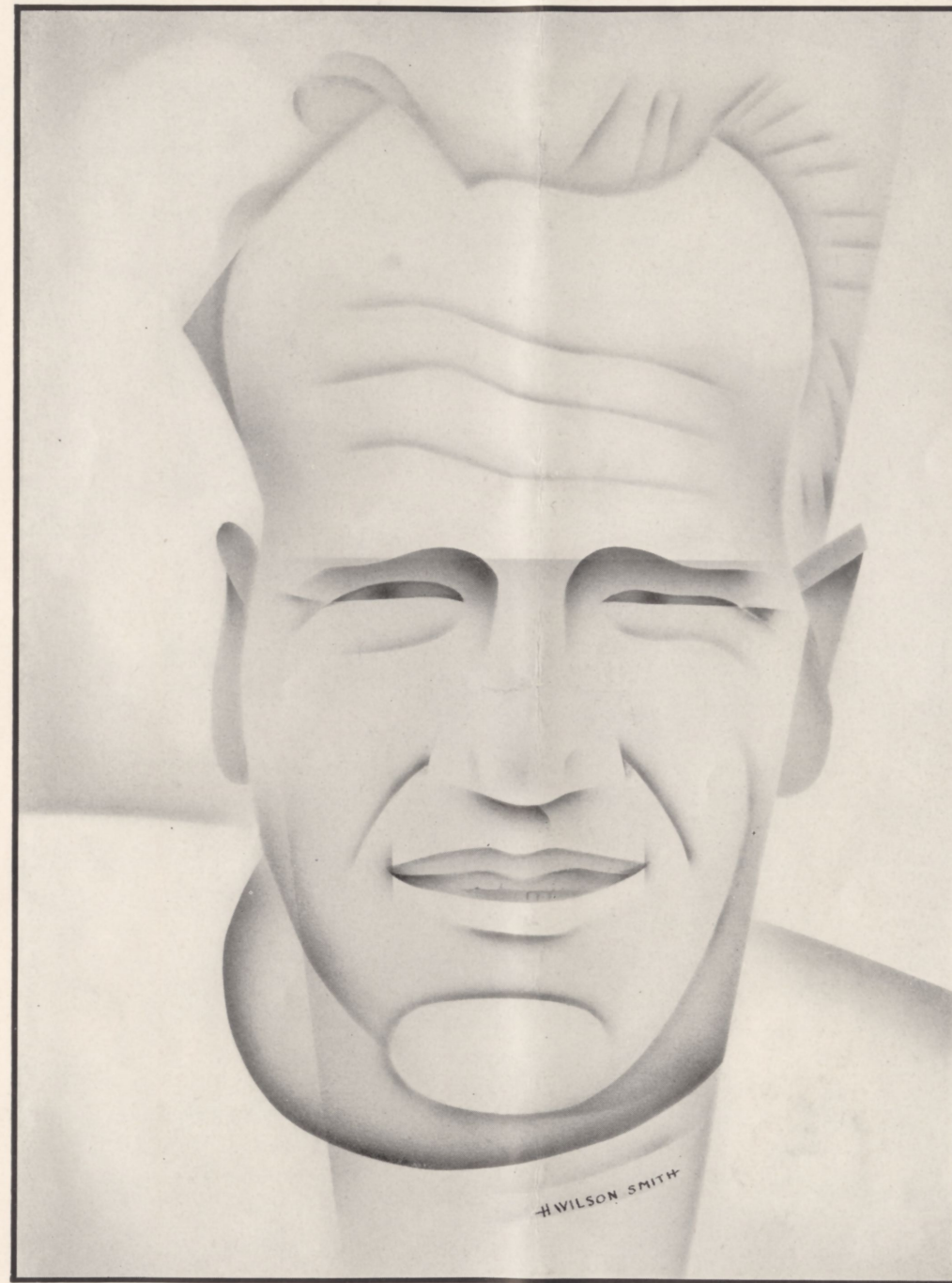
**BILL BEASLEY**

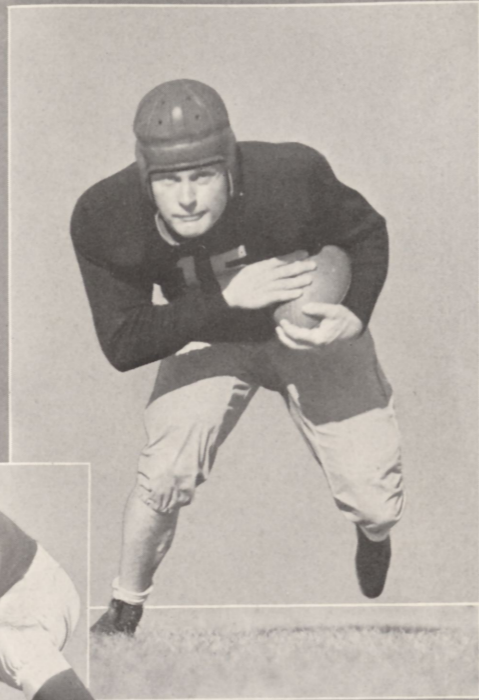
**BILL INGRAM**

count in future games. The two guards and the two tackles, with only "Butch" Medanich missing, will be as important today as they were last year.

All indications are that the Gaels will be galloping full tilt here today, with their strongest backfield lineup—including Mr. "Rubberlegs" Baird—on the field at the first whistle. Baird, who has been ill, will be playing his first game of the 1932 season is ably abetted by Angel Brovelli, Captain Bill Beasley and George Dodson—as formidable a quartet of backs as you may see in action this season. With a young gentleman named George Wilson on the bench in reserve, along with several other capable backs, the Gaels will command unusual attacking strength.

The Bears, on the other hand, have been weakened offensively by the loss of a number of backs, and the combination that will start today is hardly the strongest that might be assembled. "Hank" Schaldach, still mending an ankle injury, will be held in reserve for use in emer-

gency only, and it looks very much as though the Bears will rely, as they did on more than one occasion last year, on a defensive game.

## THE FRESHMAN GAME

Pasadena Junior College today gives the University of California freshman football team its last test before the Bear frosh open a four-year period of rivalry with the University of Southern California. The Trobables of U. S. C. are planning a warm reception for the Bear youngsters in Los Angeles a week from today, climatically and otherwise.

In two earlier games of the season, the California freshmen encountered strong opposition from San Mateo Junior College, winning by the narrow margin of 7 to 6, and then breezed through the negligible opposition furnished by Oneonta Military Academy, 63-0.

Today, the freshmen meet a team with several veterans on its squad, with reserve strength, and with a fancy attack, prepared by Frank Baker, formerly of the University of Washington, and Louis Vincenti, who played end on the Stanford varsity not so many years ago.

Pasadena, a heavy squad as junior college teams go, must give away several pounds per man to the California yearlings this afternoon, and this is especially true in the center of the line where a "pony" trio handles the assignment.

Talbot Lionberger, letterman of 1931 and center, tips the beams at 160 pounds. His team mate at left guard, little Roy Gertmenian, is four pounds lighter and but 5 feet 6½ inches tall. The third of the trio, Clifford Derverian, right guard, is the heaviest at 167.

Against these men will be William Stone, center; Conrad Tenney, right guard, and Albert Soulies, left guard. Stone and Tenney each weigh 185 pounds. Soulies carries an even 200 pounds.

Tackles and ends, however, on the jay-see team hold their own in the matter of

physical specifications. The first string quartet average 182 pounds in weight, 6 feet 2½ inches tall, and should provide a good test to the off-tackle and end run plays which Clinton Evans has given to the yearling squad.

With this set-up in the line, the Bear freshmen can expect a wide open game from today's opponents.

Evans, who likes power in his football—the power that comes from hard blocking and heavy line plunging—also has a flare for deception. He may elect to try some of his pet plays today before meeting the Southern California freshmen.

The California yearlings will be on some kind of a "spot" for the next few weeks. While Pasadena should fall before the attack today, next Saturday's game is another story. The Trojan frosh, not undefeated, have power and speed and will cause the Bear youngsters much trouble during their game, according to reports.

If the freshmen should successfully down the Trobables, a more formidable opponent faces them the following week in Compton Junior College. Unusually strong, Compton served warning to future opponents last week with a smashing 33-0 victory over the Trojan yearlings.

Two new backfield men blossomed forth in last week's debacle. Ronald Collier, formerly of Oakland High School, showed that he would be an able substitute for Floyd Blower, regular left halfback. Collier scored three of his team's many touchdowns and turned in several nice runs.

William Swabel was the chief surprise, however. Not a member of the freshman "A" squad, he got into the game, put on an exhibition of open field running and in general turned in a good afternoon's work. In fact, his work was of such caliber that he made the grade to the "A" squad. He will wear Jersey No. 16 today.

## STADIUM INFORMATION

**EMERGENCY HEADQUARTERS:** Are located at regular stations, plainly marked, at the north and south ends of the Stadium. The emergency station at the south end is located on the inside walkway below sections "KK" and "L"; the one at the north end is just inside the coliseum wall below sections "XX" and "A."

**PHYSICIANS AND NURSES:** Medical attendants will be on duty at emergency stations at all times during the game.

**POLICE HEADQUARTERS:** Are located at the north end of the Stadium inside of the coliseum wall below sections "AA" and "B." A police sub-station is located at the south end of the Stadium just inside of the coliseum wall.

**AMBULANCES:** In case of emergency ambulances may be found outside of the Stadium wall. Usher captains will be able to give explicit directions to points where they are stationed.

**TELEPHONES:** Public telephones are located at a number of points outside of the Stadium wall and inside of the fences.

**REST ROOMS:** Will be found along the west side and at both ends of the Stadium at the walkways below the entrances to the stands. On the east side of the Stadium the women's rest room is located opposite sections "T" and "TT," across the roadway; the men's rest room is opposite sections "PP" and "Q" across the roadway.

**CONCESSIONS:** Ice cream, soft drinks, sandwiches, cigars and cigarettes and candies are offered for sale at booths operated by the Associated Students for the convenience of spectators. These booths are located at various points inside the Stadium.

**PUBLIC ADDRESS SYSTEM:** The public address system is intended primarily for the information of spectators. Physicians and others expecting urgent messages should register their names and seat locations at police headquarters, north end of the Stadium.
